

Dear Students and Parents:

This packet of information includes useful advice on getting started or continuing the college search/application process. The components of this package can be completed during the last of the junior year, during the summer or in the early fall of the senior year. Please read the enclosed handout and, as always, if you need additional information please feel free to contact me in the college counseling office. There are two processes involved in the college search/application process. Please be sure to review the **college application** process addressed in this packet. This process must be initiated in the fall of the senior year. Please remember that some colleges **do not require** letters of recommendation; **if a letter is not required, the Student Profile Packet does not need to be completed and letters of recommendation do not need to be sent.**

Writing a **college recommendation** letter that presents an accurate and vivid portrait of a student is extremely demanding and time consuming. The average length of time required to do a good job ranges from one and one-half to two hours for each letter. To help me do the best possible letter for you, I request that you follow the guidelines below.

1. Fill out the student profile packet **completely** so that I have information about your special interests, talents, activities and personal qualities. More specific information helps me write better letters!
2. **Be sure to sign the waiver/release of information form on the front page of the profile packet.**
3. Distribute the teaching rating forms to two (2) teachers, 1 or 2 academic teachers and/or possibly one special interest teacher such as art, drama, etc. (The teacher will return their form to me, not to the student.)
4. Return the completed student profile to me, allowing at least four (4) weeks to review the information and write the letter of recommendation. I would like to have all forms back by Monday, September 20, 2004.

College Application Process

1. During the spring of your junior year or the summer before your senior year (or now, if you haven't started), make a list of all of the colleges which interest you. Include the complete address, phone number and contact person in the admissions office for each school on your list.
2. On a post card purchased from the post office, request an application and financial aid information from each of the colleges that interest you. Some schools provide services through the internet, some encourage you to apply online, and will waive the application fee for online applications.
3. Try to reduce the number of schools (5-7) to which you plan to apply; this will save both you and your parents much frustration, a great deal of time, and many precious dollars in application fees.
4. Once you have decided on the colleges to which you will apply, make xerox copies of the complete application to each of those schools. The xerox copy will serve as your rough draft on which you can white out or cross out any mistakes that you make.
5. Meanwhile, put the actual applications in a folder for safe keeping. In this folder, you should also store the addresses and phone numbers of all the colleges that you are interested in and a copy of your complete activity sheet/resume which you should send to each college with your application.
6. Each student is responsible for providing colleges with their activity sheet/resume. This should be comprised of a listing of all extracurricular activities including those connected with the school, community and church. Keep in mind that quantity is not as important as quality. Continuous involvement in a couple of activities and assumption of leadership positions is more positive than involvement in many activities with no leadership roles.
